Also available is an optional pre-tour extension to Rome, featuring sites of deep interest to Christian travelers. The extension departs the USA on May 29.

### Day 1 – June 01 (Fri) – Depart from your home city to Berlin, Germany

Pricing includes airfare from New York or Chicago. Air add-ons or alternative flight schedules are available from all other cities. You can join the group in New York, Chicago or on arrival at the Berlin airport – coinciding with the group's arrival.

### Day 2 – June 02 (Sat) – Arrive in Berlin, Germany

On arrival at the Berlin Airport, pass through customs and meet the Tour Director who will be with you for the entire tour. Board the coach for an orientation drive, showcasing the three centers of Berlin: the west around Kurfuerstendamm Boulevard and the Memorial Church, the new center around Potsdamer Square, and the eastern section around Unter Den Linden, Brandenburg Gate and AlexanderPlatz.

Continue to your hotel for check-in. Later, join together for a welcome drink and brief meeting before our dinner at the hotel. Pastor Lutzer will take the group for an evening walk after dinner. **(D)** (When B, L or D is shown it indicates meals included that particular day).

### Day 3 – June 03 (Sun) – Berlin

What other city in Europe has changed over the last ten years as much as Berlin? Our tour of this once divided metropolis includes the elegant Ku-Damm, the restored Reichstag, monumental Brandenburg Gate, Charlotten Palace, the 210-foot Victory Column in the vast Tiergarten Park and a visit to the Kaiser Wilhelm Memorial Church.

After lunch together, we'll visit the Pergamom Museum, one of the five wonderful museums that sit on Berlin's Museum Island. The Pergamon Museum is divided into three distinct sections: the Antiquity Collection, the Islamic Art Museum, and the Near East Museum. We'll have dinner at our hotel. **(B,L, D)**

### Day 4 – June 04 (Mon) – Berlin – Potsdam – Wittenberg

This morning we travel to Potsdam, the Brandenburg state capital. We'll visit the Palace Cecilienhof, where in 1945 the Potsdam Agreement was signed among the Allied Powers. Take a walk through the beautiful garden at the Palace Sanssouci and see the impressive terraces and fountains. Here is where the Kaisers ruled. Dr. Lutzer will help connect the Hilter Era with these locations and also the probable role of Europe in future Biblical prophecy. After a mid-day break for independent lunch or shopping, we'll continue to quaint Wittenberg, where we'll spend the next two nights. Dinner is at our hotel. **(B,D)**

### Day 5 – June 05 (Tue) – Wittenberg

Today's journey in Wittenberg recalls the life and work of Martin Luther. We'll see the gates of Schlosskirche (Castle Church) where he nailed his 95 Theses in 1517 challenging the Catholic Church; then visit the Stadtkirche, (City Church) where Luther and his associates preached the gospel to the common people.

We'll visit the Lutherhalle, an important museum located in the Augustinian monastery in which Luther lived, first as a monk and later as owner with his wife Katharina von Bora and family.

Lutherhalle's collection of objects related to the history of the German Reformation include Luther's own desk, the pulpit from which he preached at the Stadtkirche, his teaching robe, and first editions of his books. We'll have dinner at our hotel.

**Day 6 – June 06 (Wed) – Wittenberg – Eisleben – Erfurt**

Our journey continues to Eisleben, situated in the countryside of the Harz Mountains. Luther was born, baptized, and died here in Eisleben. After we visit the house where he was born and the Sterbehaus Museum, the house where he died, we'll continue to Erfurt, Luther's spiritual home. Our visit will include the Augustinian Monastery where Luther served as a monk.

Enjoy our lunch at Luther's Cellar, after which we'll visit the Franciscan Church where Luther preached in 1529 and St. Mary's Church, where he was ordained as a priest. Overnight in Erfurt.

**Day 7 – June 07 (Thu) – Erfurt – Eisenach – Nuremberg – Romantic Road – Munich**

This morning depart for Eisenach in the Thuringian Forest, where little has changed since the Middle Ages. Visit Luther House, where Luther was educated from 1498-1501. Continue to Wartburg Castle, where Luther took shelter from the wrath of the Pope and translated the New Testament from Greek to German.

After an independent lunch (or shopping), we'll make our way to Nürnberg to see the chilling stadium where Nazi rallies took place and the Coliseum that Hitler started but never completed. We'll travel on to Munich via the Romantic Road, passing through the picturesque towns of Dinkelsbühl and Nördlingen. Enjoy dinner tonight at our hotel.

**Day 8 – June 08 (Fri) – Munich**

This morning, join Pastor Lutzer for a Hitler and the Third Reich Walking Tour. We'll see the beer halls which hosted the first small gatherings of those who would one day lead the Third Reich, and the place where Hitler made his first major speeches. We'll walk through the streets where Hitler fought his way to power to the headquarters from which he bullied the world! Pastor Lutzer will share his perspective on how events of the Hitler

period affected the Christian world. Continue your conversations at dinner at our hotel.

**Day 9 – June 09 (Sat) – Munich – Excursion to Berchtesgaden**

Travel today through the beautiful Bavarian Alps to Berchtesgaden. En route, Pastor Lutzer will give a brief account of Hitler's life. You'll learn the history of Obersalzberg's takeover by the Nazi Party and Martin Bormann's transformation of the mountain into Hitler's Southern Headquarters. At Obersalzberg, the tiny community below Berchtesgaden, we'll board a mountain coach for a breathtaking drive up to Eagle's Nest. A marble-lined tunnel leads into the heart of the mountain where you board the original brass-lined elevator for a ride up through the heart of Kehlstein mountain. Constructed as a 50<sup>th</sup> birthday gift for Adolf Hitler, the diplomat teahouse's construction details and history will be told during our tour. Return to Munich for dinner at our hotel.

**Day 10 – June 10 (Sun) – Munich – Montreux, Switzerland**

Today is a traveling day. See quaint alpine towns and high-peaked landscapes while tracing the spine of this iconic mountain range. Dinner is included at the hotel. **(B,D)**

**Day 11 – June 11 (Mon) – Montreux**

From your base in Montreux on Lake Geneva, explore Geneva, the city that was the center of the Swiss Reformation movement with John Calvin as its chief theologian. Visit St. Peter's Cathedral, where Calvin taught the Reformed doctrine. We'll see his chair and climb 157 steps up to the top of the North Tower, where the view is worth the effort! Under the Cathedral are the ruins of a Roman sanctuary, a 4<sup>th</sup> century basilica and a 6<sup>th</sup> century church. Calvin's Academy is nearby and is called the Protestant Lecture Hall. John Knox also taught here for three years. Next we'll view the reformation monument which was constructed between 1909 and 1917. This impressive structure is referred to as the "Protestant Rome." The giant wall displays statues of four Geneva Reformation leaders: Guillaume Farel, John Calvin, Theodore Beza and John Knox. Spend the afternoon shopping or relaxing by the lake, then rejoin the group for dinner at our hotel.

### **Day 12 – June 12 (Tue) – Montreux – Zurich**

This morning travel to Zurich, a beautiful city filled with history and ambience and framed by the breathtaking Alps. Zurich was at the center of the Swiss Reformation in the 16<sup>th</sup> century under the leadership of Ulrich Zwingli. We'll visit the Grossmunster Church, mother church of the Reformation in Switzerland and the place where Zwingli began teaching his Reform theologies that led to Zurich's freedom from Rome's control. Also see the Helferei where Zwingli lived. Visit the shore of the Limmat River where the Anabaptists were drowned. Our Farewell Dinner is at our hotel. **(B,D)**

### **Day 13 – June 13 (Wed) – Zurich – Transfer to the Airport**

Group transfer to the Zurich Airport.

### **Optional Pre-Tour Extension to Christian Rome**

#### **Day 1-May 29 (Tue) – Flights to Rome, Italy**

Pricing includes airfare from New York or Chicago. Air add-ons or alternative flight schedules are available from all other cities. You can join the group in New York, Chicago or on arrival at the Rome airport – coinciding with the group's arrival.

#### **Day 1-May 30 (Wed) - Arrival**

Arrive in Rome this morning. On your way to the city we'll take a brief walking tour to see Trevi Fountain, the Spanish Steps, the Pantheon (originally built by Augustus Caesar in 31AD) and the lovely Piazza Navona. You have a little time to rest at the hotel before meeting at a lively pizzeria for dinner. **(D)**

#### **Day 2-May 31 (Thur) - Touring in Rome**

After breakfast we'll visit an ancient area of Rome known for the early church paintings and sketches of Jesus Christ and his disciples, located underground. It is here that we will visit the Mamertime, where Peter and Paul were imprisoned. We will walk around Capitoline Hill and see the Arch of Titus (from 82AD) – significant because it is adorned with depictions of the pillage of Jerusalem. We will enter the famous Coliseum to see the prison cells and lion cages, and then walk the Circus Maximus where many Christians were martyred. You'll have time to grab a casual lunch (or shop) before we proceed

to the oldest Christian catacombs of Rome, - "the Domitilla" – also known for its early Christianity. We walk a bit of the Appian Way to get a feel for how Paul, Peter, Priscilla and Aquila felt as they entered the pagan city. Even today, you can see the remains of this ancient walkway and the overhead aqueduct lined with its shattered statues and busts. Afterward, we visit the site where the Apostle Paul was beheaded and then buried. Tonight is a free evening to rest. **(B)**

#### **Day 3 - June 1 (Fri) – Touring in Rome**

Early today, we'll visit the Vatican, Vatican City and its Museums, ending with the spectacular painting of the "Last Judgment" on the ceiling of the Sistine Chapel. On our return to the Old City of Rome we view Scala Sancta – the stairs said to be the originals that Jesus walked prior to his condemnation by Pontius Pilate. The stairs are adjacent to one of the most famous Basilicas of Rome...San Giovanni Laterano - formerly pagan. We'll learn the history that incorporates Mussolini's Fascist era buildings, and Dr. Lutzer will share his thoughts on Moussolini's effect on Christianity in Italy. Finally we'll visit some of the striking piazzas that dot Rome's corners. Today enjoy a free afternoon to shop the fashionable streets of Via Del Corso and the Condotti. We'll dine tonight in the oldest part of Rome...Trastevere. The meandering, narrow cobbled streets are alive with late-night diners. **(B,D)**

#### **Day 4 - June 2 (Sat) – Travel to Berlin**

Have breakfast at your leisure. We depart Rome at 11:35AM to meet our friends in Berlin. **(B,D)**

## Terms and Conditions

### Operation and Participation

This tour has been developed and is managed by **Living Passages** (hereafter in this document referred to as **LP**.) The tour is considered exclusive and private. Circumstances prohibit transfer of participation to passengers other than those to whom the tickets were originally issued.

Pricing shown for the core tour is based on a minimum of 25 participants. In the unlikely event that the group is smaller than 25 participants, the tour price could go up as high as \$600 more per person for the core tour. We will do everything possible, including taking advantage of currency fluctuations to not allow that to happen.

### Proper Documentation

All participants in this tour must have (by the time we travel not at the time of registration), passports valid at least through December 10, 2012. Visas are not required for U.S. citizens; if you are not a U.S. citizen, contact LP regarding visa requirements.

### Limitations

The air carrier(s), group operators and LP reserve the right to substitute equipment and properties and to add or delete en route stops at their discretion with or without notice. The hotels, ground operators, and other vendors used by LP reserve the right, in special circumstances, to substitute accommodations/transportation of similar or better quality without penalty.

### Baggage

LP cannot be held responsible for delay, loss, or damage to baggage. Travelers are encouraged to check the Tour Tips sheets to find ways to reduce the likelihood or minimize the problem of having lost or delayed luggage. LP will send suggestions with your final documents on what NOT to take in carryon luggage.

U.S. airline baggage regulations apply to all of your international flight arrangements. However, we urge you to limit your luggage to one piece per person because of limited luggage space on the motor coach you'll be using. And all airlines are now limiting free luggage. You can take extra – just at a potentially hefty expense. Check with your carrier for their restrictions. The bus operator and hotels may also charge if you take more than 1 bag plus your carryon.

### Making your Deposit/Reservations

A total deposit of \$1,379 per person is due for those not adding the optional Rome extension to the itinerary. A total deposit of \$1,729 per person is due if for those including the pre-tour Rome extension; this includes the insurance premium add-on to increase your coverage. This deposit is due with your signed registration form to confirm your space. The balance of your payment will be due by **March 12, 2012**.

**NOTE:** *Living Passages, calling on years of experience with travelers, heartily recommends trip insurance and includes the premiums for our group plan in the deposits due. If you choose to decline this insurance, contact Living Passages. We will send you a waiver form which we must have on file.*

### Changes/Revisions

If specific rooming requests are altered due to cancellation by one or more passengers and we are unable to locate a roommate for that single passenger, the passenger still traveling may be required to pay the applicable single room rate for all the accommodations. Various vendors may also charge fees for changes; those fees will be passed through to the traveler.

### Airport Arrivals/Security

You should plan to check in at your international departure airport at least 2 hours prior to scheduled departure. More time will be required due to your international flight plans than domestic flights ordinarily require. We will have a limited number of Business Class seats (at an additional cost). Advise us if you are interested in upgrading.

### Cancellation and Refunds

In the event that you must cancel your reservation, or payments are not received by specified deadlines, refunds are made in accordance with the following schedule:

Per person cancellation fee if notice is received

- 125 to 70 days prior to scheduled departure: Cancellation fee per person is \$350 plus any airfare purchased on your behalf or the cost of any insurance purchased.





- 69-10 days prior to scheduled departure: Cancellation fee is per person is 40% of the package price PLUS all air costs and insurance paid to LP.
- 9 days or less prior to scheduled departure: Cancellation fee per person is 100% of all monies received.
- Notice that once received, all insurance premiums are non-refundable, regardless of when cancellation notice is received.

#### Air Transportation

International group air fare out of Chicago or New York is included in your package. After receiving your deposit, LP will contact you regarding flights from your home area, and advise you of options if you want to upgrade your flights or originate at more convenient airports.

#### Fuel Surcharges, currency fluctuation, and other unexpected changes

With fuel charges changing rapidly worldwide, both carriers and ground operators have been instituting surcharges to accommodate increases. We have based prices on rates and currency exchange current at the time of printing; if vendors or countries charge fuel charges and/or taxes, or if the currency exchange rate changes significantly, we may need to pass resulting increases on to our passengers.

#### Responsibility

Living Passages is located at 105 North 1<sup>st</sup> Street, Suite 200, Coeur d'Alene, ID 83814 and has the responsibility of booking with airlines, hotels, ground operators, tour guides, and various other service providers to provide you with the services described in this brochure. The carriers, hotels, cruise lines, and other suppliers providing services are independent contractors and are not agents, employees, or servants of, or joint venturers with, LP or its affiliates. All certificates and other travel documents for tour services issued by LP are subject to the terms and conditions specified by the supplier and to the laws of the countries in which the services are supplied.

Each participant agrees not to hold Living Passages or its tour leaders or The Moody Church liable, in the absence of their own negligence, for any loss, act or omission, whether negligent or otherwise, of any person or firm which is to, or does provide goods or services for the trip. Neither LP nor The Moody Church shall have any liability to the participant for the quality of services or the condition or cleanliness of accommodations or for any transportation delay, including but not limited to liability for inconvenience, shortened vacation time, additional expense, or any other kind of damage. LP is not responsible for government actions, weather, mechanical breakdowns, war, terrorism, acts of God, or other circumstances beyond its control.

#### Optional Activities

Tour participants may choose to engage in various activities including, but not limited to, swimming, jogging, climbing, exploring, water sports, horseback or riding, car rental traveling, and other "activities;" participants are hereby notified that such activities may be dangerous and may result in a serious injury and that participation in these activities shall be at the participant's own risk. LP shall not be liable for any injuries sustained by participants which are a result of participant's engaging in such activities.

#### Major Changes

LP has contracted with certain hotels to supply accommodation. Occasionally, the accommodation reserved is not available for a variety of reasons (e.g. unexpected maintenance problems, guest stayovers, over-booking by the hotel) and a substitute hotel of equal or greater quality is provided.

#### Trip Insurance

Your initial deposit price includes the cost of the 360° Travel Protection Plan. A 360° Travel Protection Certificate will be sent to you along with the receipt of your deposit. You may request a copy of the 360° Travel Protection Plan insurance certificate prior to purchase by contacting LP. The travel protection plan is underwritten by Stonebridge Casualty Insurance Company, an AEGON company, Columbus, OH (NAIC # 10952), and designed by Travelex Insurance Services.
